RS 5134A/3134A - Navigating Freedom of Religion & Accommodation in Canada

An introduction to the legal issues and social discourse surrounding freedom of religion and accommodation of religious beliefs and practices in light of the *Ontario Human Rights Code* an the *Charter of Rights and Freedoms*. What are the duties of service providers and employers to accommodate religious belief and practice to the point of undue hardship? What happens when freedom of religious practice and belief collide with other human rights? And what is the role of the religious leader in assisting institutions and claimants navigate the accommodation jungle gym?
